Federal programs across the NIH and CDC are essential to California's fight against diabetes. Cuts threaten the research, prevention, and infrastructure supporting the 2.5M adults in California living with diabetes.¹

NIDDK | National Institute of Diabetes and Digestive & Kidney Diseases Current Funding: **\$97.1M**

- The NIDDK currently funds **198 projects** across California, with **\$32.3M** committed to diabetes-related research in 2024 alone.^{1,2}
- The NIDDK supports **61 active clinical trials**.³
- Cuts would threaten this nationwide research engine that advances care and improves health outcomes for over 2M Californians.

DNPAO | CDC Division of Nutrition, Physical Activity, and Obesity FY 2024 Funding: **\$2.5M**

- Cuts would disrupt **\$2.5M** in statewide efforts to reduce the risk of chronic conditions through nutrition access, physical activity infrastructure, and obesity prevention:
 - **\$880,000** to the California Department of Health for the State Physical Activity and Nutrition (SPAN) program.
 - **\$1.5M** to the County of San Diego and Public Health Advocates for Racial and Ethnic Approaches to Community Health (REACH) programs.⁴

Expanding Nutrition Access

through produce prescription programs, voucher incentives, and community procurement practices.

Promoting Early Health

with early care and education assessments, and breastfeeding support.

Encouraging Active Lifestyles

by improving community design that supports physical activity in targeted communities.⁵

National DPP | CDC National Diabetes Prevention Program FY 2023 Funding: **\$1.2M**⁶

- National DPP supports diabetes prevention programs for over **130,000 enrollees** offered by **117 organizations** across **73 cities**.^{7,8}
- Cuts would disrupt access to evidence-based lifestyle interventions shown to reduce the risk of type 2 diabetes by **58%** in adults and **71%** among seniors.⁹

DDT | CDC Division of Diabetes Translation Current Funding: **\$5.6M**

- Cuts would threaten **\$5.6M** that supports the California Department of Public Health in tracking, preventing, and managing diabetes.⁷
